## **ST. LOUIS CIRCUIT ATTORNEY AND UNITED STATES ATTORNEY REPORT WEEKLY RESULTS OF ST. LOUIS REGIONAL CEASEFIRE INITIATIVE**

St. Louis, Missouri: The following represents the prosecution activities under the St. Louis Regional Ceasefire Initiative, a component of the Bush Administration's Project Safe Neighborhoods Program, United States Attorney James G. Martin and St. Louis Circuit Attorney Jennifer Joyce announced today.

These cases are the result of the collaborative efforts of federal and local law enforcement including the U.S. Attorney's Office, the St. Louis City Circuit Attorney's Office, the St. Louis County Prosecutor's Office, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), the U.S. Marshal's Service, the Drug Enforcement Administration, the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department and the St. Louis County Police Department.

This week's results of Project Safe Neighborhood/Ceasefire are as follows:

### **ST. LOUIS CIRCUIT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE:**

JOHN W. JONES, JR., 29, of the 2000 block of Ranchdale in Jennings, Missouri, was sentenced to serve 7 years in the Missouri Department of Corrections on July 20, 2004. Jones was sentenced after pleas of guilty to unlawful use of a weapon - carrying a concealed weapon, attempted escape from confinement, and possession of marijuana under 35 grams.

JEFFERY BOURRAGE, 22, of the 5400 block of Union, was found guilty by a jury of one count of possession of a controlled substance and one count of unlawful use of a weapon - carrying a concealed weapon on July 21, 2004. Bourrage faces a maximum sentence of fifteen years incarceration when he is sentenced on September 10, 2004 by Judge Jimmie Edwards in Division

19 of the Circuit Court for the City of St. Louis.

**UNITED STATES ATTORNEY'S OFFICE**

ANTONIO DEANDRO McAFEE, 34, of the 1200 block of Bristol Lane, St. Louis, 63106, was sentenced to 60 months in prison, without parole on one felony count of possession of a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime.

JON R. WHITE, 36, of the 8900 block of Newby, St. Louis, was sentenced to 36 months in prison, without parole, on one felony count of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm.

LEWIS GRANT, 29, of the 2500 block of St. Louis, was sentenced to 24 months in prison on one felony count of being a felon in possession of a firearm.

AMOS INGRAM, 48, of the 5000 block of Arlington, St. Louis, 63120, was sentenced to 72 months in prison, without parole on one felony count of possession with intent to distribute heroin and one felony count of possession of a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime.

LARRY HAYES, 24, of the 4200 block of John, St. Louis, pled guilty to two felony counts of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm. Hayes now faces a maximum penalty of ten years in prison and/or a fine of \$250,000, per count. Sentencing has been set for October 22, 2004.

JOHN HENRY BLAKE, 22, 2900 block of Sullivan, 63107, pled guilty to one felony count of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm. Blake now faces a maximum penalty of ten years in prison and/or a fine of \$250,000. Sentencing has been set for October 22, 2004.

JERRY OUSLEY, 24, of the 1400 block of Pine, St. Louis, 63103, pled guilty to one felony count of being a felon in possession of a firearm. Ousley now faces a maximum penalty of ten years in prison and/or a fine of \$250,000. Sentencing has been set for October 22, 2004.
