ATF TO PARTICIPATE IN LOS ANGELES CAREER EXPO

LOS ANGELES – The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) will be among 17 federal law enforcement agencies participating in the Los Angeles Federal Law Enforcement Career Expo to be held Saturday, March 31, from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm, at the Glendale KIA, 2242 San Fernando Road, in Los Angeles.

ATF will provide informational packets outlining the specific requirements for positions within the agency. Basic requirements to become an ATF criminal investigator (special agent) include the following: must be a U.S. citizen; be between the ages of 21 and 37 at time of appointment; take and pass the Treasury Enforcement Agent Examination; and possess a bachelor's degree or three years of general work experience that meets additional criteria. Applications for position openings or testing opportunities will only be accepted in response to a specific ATF job notice or vacancy announcement.

In addition to ATF, agencies participating in the Career Expo include: Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP); Department of State, Diplomatic Security Service (DSS); Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA); Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI); Federal Protective Service (FPS); Internal Revenue Service – Criminal Investigation (IRS/CID); Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS); Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration; U.S. Border Patrol; U.S. Coast Guard; U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP); U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services – OIG; U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE); U.S. Marshal's Service (USMS); U.S. Postal Inspection Service (UPIS) and the U.S. Secret Service (USSS).
