## **HILLSIDE MAN SENTENCED TO 188 MONTHS IN FEDERAL PRISON FOR GUN CRIMES**

CHICAGO- Andrew L. Traver, Special Agent in Charge of the Chicago Division of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, today announced that Terrence Slaughter, age 39, of Hillside, Illinois, was sentenced to serve 188 months in the Federal Bureau of Prisons. U.S. District Judge George Lindberg sentenced Slaughter for possession of stolen firearms after having been previously convicted of a felony.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Carrie Hamilton as a result of a cooperative investigation by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives and the Illinois State Police.

Slaughter was sentenced on October 24, 2007 on a 2-count indictment for stealing eight firearms, including assault rifles, from the residence of Dennis Kalinoski of Riverside, Illinois. Kalinoski, a retired Illinois State Police Sergeant who, at the time, was under suspicion for violating Federal and State firearms laws.

Slaughter has been in the custody of the U.S. Marshals Service since his arrest after being indicted by a federal grand jury on May 7, 2003.
