**LOUISVILLE CRACK DEALER SENTENCED TO 5 YEARS AND 10 MONTHS FOR
POSSESSION WITH INTENT TO DISTRIBUTE CRACK COCAINE**

- Street value approximately \$3,800

LOUISVILLE, KY - Kristopher Randle, age 32, of Louisville, Kentucky, in Jefferson County, was sentenced to 5 years and 10 months imprisonment in United States District Court, Louisville, Kentucky, for possession with intent to distribute 5 grams or more of crack cocaine, U.S. Attorney David L. Huber of the Western District of Kentucky and Paul Vido, Special Agent in Charge of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), Louisville Field Division jointly announced today. Charles R. Simpson, III, Judge, United States District Court, also sentenced Randle to 4 years supervised release following incarceration. There is no parole in the federal judicial system.

Randle plead guilty on July 2, 2007, and admitted that on August 2, 2006, law enforcement officers executed a search warrant at his house in Louisville, Kentucky, finding crack cocaine weighing 37.96 grams in a closet. The crack was individually packaged for resale. Randle admitted to police that he had been selling crack cocaine. The crack cocaine in this case has a street value of approximately \$3,800.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney John E. Kuhn, Jr., and it was investigated by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives.
