GLASGOW, KENTUCKY CRACK DEALER PLEADS GUILTY TO DRUG CHARGES

- Jeremy Depp pleads guilty to trafficking cocaine and to crack house charges

BOWLING GREEN, KY - Jeremy Allen Depp, age 28, of Glasgow, Kentucky, in Barren County, pled guilty on December 4, 2007, to distributing crack cocaine, possessing 5 grams or more of crack with the intent to distribute it and two counts of possessing with intent to distribute crack cocaine, U.S. Attorney David L. Huber of the Western District of Kentucky and Paul Vido, Special Agent in Charge of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), Louisville Field Division jointly announced today.

Depp admitted that on December 18, 2006, he distributed crack cocaine and possessed 5 grams or more of crack with the intent to distribute it. Depp also pled guilty to maintaining a house for narcotics distribution and narcotics use, which is an offense charged under what is commonly known as the "Crack House Statute."

The maximum potential penalties are life imprisonment, a \$6,500,000 fine, and supervised release for a period of up to life.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney John E. Kuhn, Jr. The Bowling Green Field Office of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) conducted the investigation as part of ATF's mandated mission to reduce violent crime and other threats to public safety.

The plea was entered before Thomas B. Russell, Judge, United States District Court,

Bowling Green, Kentucky.

Depp is scheduled to be sentenced before Judge Russell on March 5, 2008, at 11:00 a.m.,
in Bowling Green, Kentucky.
