DAVENPORT MAN SENTENCED ON FEDERAL FIREARMS VIOLATION IN DAVENPORT FEDERAL COURT

DAVENPORT, IA - On October 28, 2008, Domonique Deshawn Parrow, age 23, formerly of Davenport, Iowa was sentenced by United States District Court Judge John A. Jarvey to 60 months in federal prison, announced United States Attorney Matthew G. Whitaker. Parrow was sentenced after pleading guilty to being a felon in possession of a firearm. There is no parole in the federal system. After release from prison, Parrow will be subject to two years of supervised release. Parrow was also ordered to pay an assessment of \$100 to the Crime Victim Fund.

In 2004, Domonique DeShawn Parrow was convicted of a felony offense of Possession with Intent to Deliver a Controlled Substance/crack cocaine, in Scott County, Iowa. On March 30, 2008 the Davenport (Iowa) Police Department's Tactical Operations Bureau obtained and executed a search warrant at a residence on Locust Street in Davenport, Iowa. As officers approached the residence, and knocked to announced their presence, Parrow jumped through a broken out west side window.

Davenport officers conducting perimeter security, immediately took Parrow into custody. After arrest, Parrow was found in possession of a loaded Bersa, .380 caliber, semi-automatic handgun.

This case was prosecuted in the United States Attorney's Office in the Southern District of Iowa pursuant to the Project Safe Neighborhoods initiative. This investigation was conducted by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, and the Davenport Police Department.
