**FEDERAL GRAND JURY INDICTS A BOWLING GREEN
ARMED CAREER CRIMINAL**

David L. Huber, United States Attorney for the Western District of Kentucky, announced today that a federal Grand Jury in Louisville **returned an Indictment** charging **LARRY EMBRY**, age 62, of 1017 Plum Springs Road, Bowling Green, Kentucky, with possession of firearms and ammunition by a career criminal.

The Indictment charges that on April 1, 2005, **Embry**, who had been previously convicted of multiple drug trafficking charges in the Warren County Circuit Court, was found in the possession of a .20 gauge shotgun and a .12 gauge shotgun.

If convicted, the maximum potential penalties are not less than fifteen years and not more than life imprisonment, a \$250,000 fine, and supervised release for a period of 3 years.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Brian Butler, and it was investigated by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives.

Embry is scheduled to appear for arraignment before the United States Magistrate Judge on May 18, 2005, at 9:30 a.m., in Bowling Green, Kentucky.
