In matters prosecuted by the US Attorney's Office for the Southern District of West Virginia:



Beckley, WV – **Emmanuel L. Page, 40, of Beckley, WV**, was sentenced yesterday to 84 months in prison for being a felon in possession of a firearm. A Federal jury sitting in Beckley, WV, found Page guilty of the charge following his trial in April 2005. In November 2003, Page was found to be in possession of a Raven Arms .25 caliber semi-automatic pistol. He was prohibited from possessing the firearm by virtue of his 1987 conviction for theft of money orders in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Ohio. The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives conducted the investigation. Chief United States District Judge David A. Faber presided over the trial and sentencing.

Also in Beckley yesterday, **Lloyd Allen Dunbar, 40, of Maple Fork, WV,** was sentenced to 5 months imprisonment plus 5 months home confinement for being a felon in possession of a firearm. Dunbar previously pled guilty in January 2005, admitting he possessed firearms in December 2003 and February 2004. Dunbar was prohibited from possessing firearms by virtue of his felony convictions of third offense DUI in 1999 in Fayette County Circuit Court. The National Park Service and U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives conducted the investigation. Judge Faber presided over the sentencing.
