**BOWLING GREEN WOMAN PLEADS GUILTY
TO CONSPIRING TO MANUFACTURE METHAMPHETAMINE**

David L. Huber, United States Attorney for the Western District of Kentucky, announced today that **FENESA GREER**, age 44, 3224-B Barnwood Avenue, Bowling Green, Kentucky, **pled guilty** on July 6, 2005, to conspiring to manufacture methamphetamine between August 26, 2004, and December 10, 2004, to aiding and abetting the distribution of methamphetamine on August 26, 2004, and December 10, 2004, to aiding and abetting the attempt to manufacture methamphetamine on December 10, 2004, and being in possession of pseudoephedrine and methamphetamine manufacturing equipment with the intent to manufacture methamphetamine.

The charges carry maximum penalties of life in prison, a fine of \$13,000,000 and a period of supervised release of 8 years. The mandatory minimum sentence in this case is 5 years in prison. **There is no parole in the federal judicial system.**

On December 10, 2004, the Bowling Green Drug Task Force with cooperation from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives executed a search warrant at **Greer's** residence located at 3224-B Barnwood Avenue, Bowling Green, Kentucky. The execution of the

search warrant was the culmination of a lengthy investigation into methamphetamine manufacturing in and around the Bowling Green area. At **Greer's** residence, law enforcement found a methamphetamine laboratory and the present ability to manufacture a substantial quantity of methamphetamine. Law enforcement recovered approximately 500 grams of crushed pseudoephedrine, tanks altered to hold anhydrous ammonia, lithium batteries, Coleman fuel, and coffee filters. Additionally, law enforcement seized numerous surveillance cameras and equipment used to guard **Greer's** methamphetamine manufacturing and distributing activities.

Greer is scheduled to be sentenced on October 4, 2005 at 11:30 a.m. (C.D.T.) in Bowling Green, Kentucky by the Honorable Thomas B. Russell.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Brian Butler, and it was investigated by the Bowling Green Drug Task Force and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF).
