**ST. LOUIS CIRCUIT ATTORNEY AND UNITED STATES  
ATTORNEY REPORT WEEKLY RESULTS OF ST. LOUIS  
REGIONAL CEASEFIRE INITIATIVE**

St. Louis, Missouri: The following represents the prosecution activities under the St. Louis Regional Ceasefire Initiative, a component of the Bush Administration's Project Safe Neighborhoods Program, United States Attorney Catherine L. Hanaway and St. Louis Circuit Attorney Jennifer Joyce announced today.

These cases are the result of the collaborative efforts of federal and local law enforcement including the U.S. Attorney's Office, the St. Louis City Circuit Attorney's Office, the St. Louis County Prosecutor's Office, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), the U.S. Marshal's Service, the Drug Enforcement Administration, the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department and the St. Louis County Police Department.

This week's results of Project Safe Neighborhood/Ceasefire are as follows:

**ST. LOUIS CIRCUIT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE:**

JEROME MCDANIELS, of the 6200 block of Ridge was found guilty by a jury of two counts of attempted robbery first degree and two counts of armed criminal action on August 5, 2005. McDaniels faces a sentence of ten years to life incarceration in the Missouri Department of Corrections when he is sentenced by Judge Dennis M. Schaumann on September 16, 2005 in division 12 of the Circuit Courts for the City of St. Louis.

**UNITED STATES ATTORNEY'S OFFICE**

VINCENT WALLACE, 26, of the 4200 block of Miletus, St. Louis, 63033, was sentenced to 151

months in prison on one felony count of being a felon in possession of a firearm, one felony count of possession of a sawed-off shotgun and one felony count of possession with intent to distribute heroin.

DERON HOPKINS, 24, of the 3100 block of Evans, St. Louis, was sentenced to 96 months in prison on one felony count of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm.

ELISHA GIBSON, 29, of the 2000 block of Destrehan, St. Louis, was sentenced to 51 months in prison on one felony count of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm and one felony count of possession with intent to distribute marijuana.

MARLON J. BRADFORD, 32, of the 3200 block of Utah, St. Louis, 63118, was sentenced to 36 months in prison on one felony count of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm and one felony count of possession with intent to distribute marijuana.

EUGENE ROBINSON, 47, of the 4200 block of East St. Louis Street, St. Louis, 63115, was sentenced to 51 months in prison on one felony count of possessing an unregistered sawed-off shotgun.

KENNETH L. THOMPSON, 45, of the 3200 block of Itaska, St. Louis, 63116, was sentenced to 21 months in prison on one felony count of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm.

ASHLEY JARROD SATCHELL, 22, of the 4000 block of Russell, St. Louis, 63110, pled guilty to one felony count of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm. Satchell now faces a maximum penalty of ten years in prison and/or a fine of \$250,000. Sentencing has been set for October 28, 2005.

DONALD COOPER, 41, of the 3600 block of Virginia, St. Louis, pled guilty to one felony count of possession with intent to distribute crack cocaine and one felony count of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm. Cooper now faces a maximum penalty of 40 years in prison and/or a fine of \$2,000,000. Sentencing has been set for November 1, 2005.

KENNETH BEVINEAU, 38, of the 5700 block of Nottingham, St. Louis, pled guilty to one felony count of being an illegal drug user in possession of a firearm. Bevineau now faces a maximum penalty of ten years in prison and/or a fine of \$250,000. Sentencing has been set for October 28, 2005.
