TEXAS MAN SENTENCED FOR MULTI-KILO METH CONSPIRACY

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a Cedar Hills, Texas, man was sentenced in federal court today for his role in a methamphetamine conspiracy.

David Sonesourinhasack, 21, of Cedar Hills, was sentenced by U.S. District Judge Richard E. Dorr this morning to five years and 10 months in federal prison without parole. **Sonesourinhasack** also forfeited to the government \$4,400, which constitutes proceeds from the distribution of methamphetamine.

On Jan. 5, 2005, **Sonesourinhasack** pleaded guilty to the charge contained in a March 31, 2004, federal indictment. **Sonesourinhasack** admitted that he participated in a conspiracy to distribute methamphetamine between October 2003 and March 26, 2004, in Greene County, Mo. **Sonesourinhasack** admitted that he conspired to distribute more than five kilograms, but less than 15 kilograms, of methamphetamine.

Sonesourinhasack is the third co-defendant to plead guilty and be sentenced in this case.

* **Daryl Schoenfeldt**, 23, of Springfield, Mo., was sentenced on June 14, 2005, to 14 years in federal prison without parole. On Dec. 1, 2004, **Schoenfeldt** pleaded guilty to his role in the conspiracy.

* **Eric Fujan**, 23, of Branson, Mo., was sentenced on July 29, 2005, to six years in federal prison without parole. **Fujan** pleaded guilty on Aug. 12, 2004, to his role in the conspiracy.

This case is being prosecuted by Special Assistant U.S. Attorney Kimberly Weber Dean. It was investigated by the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, COMBAT (the Combined Ozarks Multi-jurisdictional Enforcement

Team), the Missouri State Highway Patrol and the Dallas County, Mo., Sheriff's Department.
