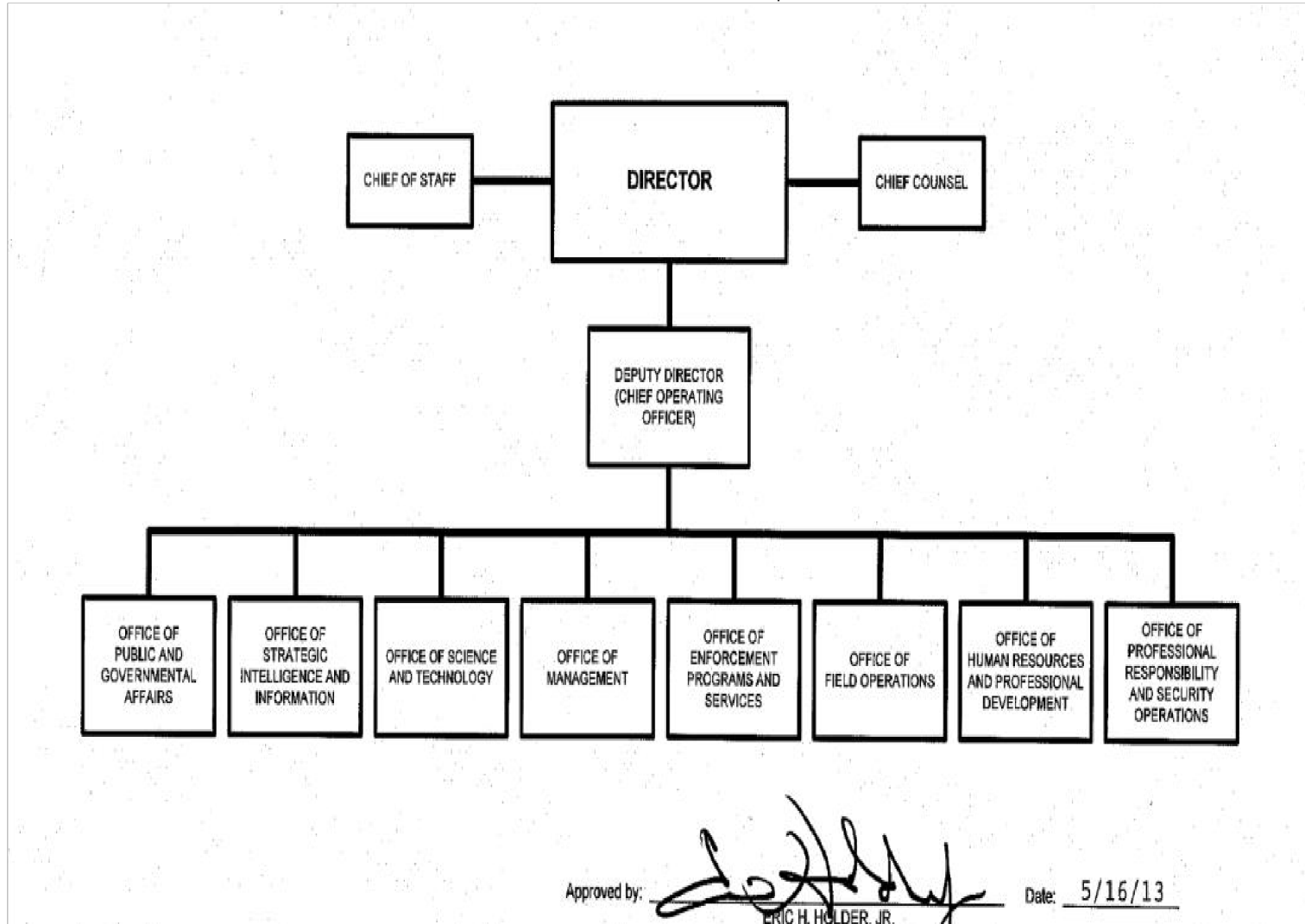

The amount requested, \$34,086, represents the pay amounts for 3/4 of the fiscal year plus appropriate benefits (\$23,860 for pay and \$10,226 for benefits.)</p>	0	62	7,961
<p>2 <u>Annualization of 2022 Approved Positions</u> Personnel: This provides for the annualization of new positions requested in 2022. Annualization of new positions extends up to 2 years to provide entry level funding in the first year, with a 1 or 2-year progression to a journeyman level. For 2022 increases, this request includes an increase of \$7,828 for full-year payroll costs associated with these additional positions. Non-Personnel: This request includes a decrease of \$2,800 for onetime items associated with the new positions, for a net of +/- \$133.</p>	0	0	6,229
<p>3 <u>Annualization of 2022 Pay Raise</u> This pay annualization represents first quarter amounts (October through December) of the 2022 pay increase of 2.7%. <p>4 <u>Changes in Compensable Days</u> Not all fiscal years have the same number of compensable days. When the BY differs from the CY, that difference is an ATB. To facilitate this move, the Department received \$1.1 billion from the proceeds of the AWS-3 auction. While these funds will support the transition off of the affected spectrum, they will not support the ongoing O&M required for the new equipment.
