The Grand Jury charges that:

COUNT 1

On or about August 8, 2013, in the Eastern District of Louisiana, the defendant, RONALD TAYLOR, having previously been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, to wit: a conviction on May 19, 2010, in case number 494-029 "B" in the Criminal District Court for the Parish of Orleans, State of Louisiana, for Aggravated Assault with a Firearm, in violation of La. R.S. 14:37.4; did knowingly possess in and affecting interstate commerce a firearm, to wit: an Israeli Military Industries model Desert Eagle, 9mm semi-automatic pistol bearing serial number 34314119, and a Glock model 19, 9mm semi-automatic pistol bearing serial number LCH283; in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(g)(1) and 924(a)(2).

NOTICE OF GUN FORFEITURE

- 1. The allegation of Count 1 of this Indictment is realleged and incorporated by reference as though set forth fully herein for the purpose of alleging forfeiture to the United States of America pursuant to the provisions of Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(d)(1) and Title 28, United States Code, Section 2461(c).
- 2. As a result of the offense alleged in Count 1, the defendant, RONALD TAYLOR, shall forfeit to the United States pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(d)(1) and Title 28, United States Code, Section 2461, any firearm or ammunition that was involved in or used in a knowing violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 922(g)(1), as alleged in Count 1 of the Indictment.
- 3. If any of the property subject to forfeiture pursuant to Paragraph 2 of this Notice of Forfeiture, as a result of any act or omission of the defendant:
 - a. cannot be located upon the exercise of due diligence;
 - b. has been transferred or sold to, or deposited with, a third person;
 - c. has been placed beyond the jurisdiction of the Court;
 - d. has been substantially diminished in value; or
 - e. has been commingled with other property which cannot be subdivided without difficulty;

it is the intent of the United States, pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853(p), to seek forfeiture of any other property of said defendant up to the value of the above forfeitable property.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(g)(1) and 924(d)(1).
