THE GRAND JURY CHARGES:

COUNT 1

On or about November 27, 2009, through on or about November 30, 2009, in the District of Arizona, defendants JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS and GERARDO CHAIDEZ-OCHOA, did conspire with each other to knowingly make a false statement and representation with respect to information required by the provisions of Chapter 44 of Title 18, United States Code, to be kept in the records of a business licensed under the provisions of Chapter 44 of Title 18, United States Code, in that JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, recruited GERARDO CHAIDEZ-OCHOA to purchase firearms and knew that in order to do that GERARDO CHAIDEZ-OCHOA would execute a Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms Form 4473, Firearms Transaction Record, representing that he was the actual buyer of the firearms indicated on the form, specifically, nine 7.62mm Romarm/Cugir rifles model WASR when in fact GERARDO CHAIDEZ-OCHOA was not the actual buyer of these firearms. It was the object of the conspiracy that the coconspirators agreed to make a false statement to a licensed firearms dealer in order to conceal the actual purchaser of the firearms.

OVERT ACTS

In furtherance of the aforesaid conspiracy, and to effect the objects of the conspiracy, the defendants and others performed and caused to be performed, among others, the following overt acts:

- 1. On or between November 27 and 30, 2009, JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS gave GERARDO CHAIDEZ-OCHOA money to purchase nine 7.62mm Romarm/Cugir model WASR rifles.
- On November 27, 28 and November 30, 2009, GERARDO CHAIDEZ-OCHOA purchased nine 7.62mm Romarm/Cugir model WASR rifles and delivered them to JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 924(a)(1)(A) and 371.

COUNT 2

On or about November 27, 2009, defendants GERARDO CHAIDEZ-OCHOA and JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, knowingly made a false statement and representation with respect to information required by the provisions of Chapter 44 of Title 18, United States Code, to be kept in the records of a federally licensed firearms dealer, a business licensed under the provisions of Chapter 44 of Title 18, United States Code, in that GERARDO CHAIDEZ-OCHOA executed a Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms Form 4473, Firearms Transaction Record, representing that he was the actual buyer of the firearms indicated on the form, specifically, two 7.62mm Romarm/Cugir model WASR rifles, when in fact he was not the actual buyer of these firearms.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 924(a)(1)(A) and 2.

COUNT 3

On or about November 28, 2009, defendants GERARDO CHAIDEZ-OCHOA and JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, knowingly made a false statement and representation with respect to information required by the provisions of Chapter 44 of Title 18, United States Code, to be kept in the records of a federally licensed firearms dealer, a business licensed under the provisions of Chapter 44 of Title 18, United States Code, in that defendant executed a Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms Form 4473, Firearms Transaction Record, representing that GERARDO CHAIDEZ-OCHOA was the actual buyer of the firearms indicated on the form, specifically, three 7.62mm Romarm/Cugir model WASR rifles, when in fact he was not the actual buyer of these firearms.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 924(a)(1)(A) and 2.

COUNT 4

On or about November 30, 2009, defendants GERARDO CHAIDEZ-OCHOA and JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, knowingly made a false statement and representation with respect to information required by the provisions of Chapter 44 of Title 18, United States Code, to be kept in the records of a federally licensed firearms dealer, a business licensed under the provisions

of Chapter 44 of Title 18, United States Code, in that defendant executed a Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms Form 4473, Firearms Transaction Record, representing that GERARDO CHAIDEZ-OCHOA was the actual buyer of the firearms indicated on the form, specifically, four 7.62mm Romarm/Cugir model WASR rifles, when in fact he was not the actual buyer of these firearms.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 924(a)(1)(A) and 2.

COUNT 5

Beginning on or about February 2010, and continuing through on or about August 2010, in the District of Arizona and elsewhere, defendant JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, did conspire with others known and unknown to the grand jury to knowingly make a false statement and representation with respect to information required by the provisions of Chapter 44 of Title 18, United States Code, to be kept in the records of federally licensed firearms dealers, businesses licensed under the provisions of Chapter 44 of Title 18, United States Code, in that JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, recruited others to purchase firearms and knew that in order to do that those persons would execute a Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms Form 4473, Firearms Transaction Record, representing that he or she was the actual buyer of the firearms indicated on the form, when in fact that person was not the actual buyer of these firearms. It was the object of the conspiracy that the co-conspirators agreed to make a false statement to licensed firearms dealers in order to conceal the actual purchaser of the firearms.

OVERT ACTS

As part, and In furtherance of the conspiracy, overt acts were committed in the District of Arizona including, but not limited to, the following:

- JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS (hereinafter SAUCEDA-CUEVAS) asked Salvador
 Figueroa Resa (hereinafter Resa) to purchase firearms for him or to have others
 purchase firearms for SAUCEDA-CUEVAS.
- 2. Resa asked Gary Large (hereinafter Large) to purchase firearms for Resa which he intended to give to SAUCEDA-CUEVAS.

- 3. On or between March 31, 2010, through on or about April 9, 2010, Large went to a federally licensed firearms dealer in Arizona and purchased 14 pistols on behalf of Resa and SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. When purchasing the firearms, Large represented to the dealer that he was the true purchaser of the firearms when, in truth and in fact, they were purchased for another.
- 4. On or between April 3, 2010 and April 7, 2010, Large went to a federally licensed firearms dealer in Arizona and purchased three rifles on behalf of Resa and SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. When purchasing the firearms, Large represented to the dealer that he was the true purchaser of the firearms when, in truth and in fact, they were purchased for another.
- 5. Resa asked Glen Harrison Goodman (hereinafter Goodman) to purchase firearms for Resa which he intended to give to SAUCEDA-CUEVAS.
- 6. On or about June 18, 2010, Goodman went to a federally licensed firearms dealer in Arizona and purchased 16 pistols on behalf of Resa and SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. When purchasing the firearms, Goodman represented to the dealer that he was the true purchaser of the firearms when, in truth and in fact, they were purchased for another.
- 7. Resa asked Angel Gabriel Ruiz (hereinafter RUIZ) to purchase firearms for Resa which he intended to give to SAUCEDA-CUEVAS.
- 8. On or about May 18, 2010, Angel Gabriel Ruiz went to a federally licensed firearms dealer in Arizona and purchased ten rifles on behalf of Resa and SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. When purchasing the firearms, Ruiz represented to the dealer that he was the true purchaser of the firearms when, in truth and in fact, they were purchased for another.
- 9. On or about May 21, 2010, Angel Gabriel Ruiz went to a federally licensed firearms dealer in Arizona and purchased ten rifles on behalf of Resa and SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. When purchasing the firearms Ruiz represented to the

- dealer that he was the true purchaser of the firearms when, in truth and in fact, they were purchased for another.
- 10. On or about May 27, 2010, Angel Gabriel Ruiz went to a federally licensed firearms dealer in Arizona and purchased two rifles on behalf of Resa and SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. When purchasing the firearms, Ruiz represented to the dealer that he was the true purchaser of the firearms when, in truth and in fact, they were purchased for another.
- 11. Resa asked Estefany Jose-Ortiz (hereinafter Jose-Ortiz) to purchase firearms for Resa which he intended to give to SAUCEDA-CUEVAS.
- 12. On or about May 19, 2010, Jose-Ortiz went to a federally licensed firearms dealer in Arizona and purchased 11 rifles on behalf of Resa and SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. When purchasing the firearms, Jose-Ortiz represented to the dealer that she was the true purchaser of the firearms when, in truth and in fact, they were purchased for another.
- 13. On or about May 26, 2010, Jose-Ortiz went to a federally licensed firearms dealer in Arizona and purchased 13 rifles on behalf of Resa and SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. When purchasing the firearms, Jose-Ortiz represented to the dealer that she was the true purchaser of the firearms when, in truth and in fact, they were purchased for another.
- 14. Resa asked Alejandro Adalberto Torres (hereinafter Torres) to purchase firearms for Resa which he intended to give to SAUCEDA-CUEVAS.
- On or about May 20, 2010, Torres went to a federally licensed firearms dealer in Arizona and purchased four rifles on behalf of Resa and SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. When purchasing the firearms, Torres represented to the dealer that he was the true purchaser of the firearms when, in truth and in fact, they were purchased for another.
- 16. On or about May 22, 2010, Torres went to a federally licensed firearms dealer in

Arizona and purchased four rifles on behalf of Resa and SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. When purchasing the firearms, Torres represented to the dealer that he was the true purchaser of the firearms when, in truth and in fact, they were purchased for another.

- 17. On or about May 25, 2010, Torres went to a federally licensed firearms dealer in Arizona and purchased ten rifles on behalf of Resa and SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. When purchasing the firearms, Torres represented to the dealer that he was the true purchaser of the firearms when, in truth and in fact, they were purchased for another.
- 18. Resa asked Nolberto Vasquez (hereinafter Vasquez) to purchase firearms for Resa which he intended to give to SAUCEDA-CUEVAS.
- 19. On or about May 26, 2010, Vasquez went to a federally licensed firearms dealer in Arizona and purchased four rifles on behalf of Resa and SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. When purchasing the firearms, Vasquez represented to the dealer that he was the true purchaser of the firearms when, in truth and in fact, they were purchased for another.
- 20. Resa asked another person to purchase firearms for Resa which he intended to give to SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. On or between August 22 and 26, 2010, that person went to a federally licensed firearms dealer in Arizona and purchased five pistols on behalf of Resa and SAUCEDA-CUEVAS. When purchasing the firearms, this person represented to the dealer that he/she was the true purchaser of the firearms when, in truth and in fact, they were purchased for another person.

 All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 924(a)(1)(A) and 371.

COUNT 6

On or about November 27, 2009, in the District of Arizona, defendant JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, intentionally and knowingly made a false and fictitious oral and written statement to, a licensed dealer of firearms within the meaning of Chapter 44, Title 18, United States Code, in

connection with the acquisition of a firearm, specifically a Century International Arms, Inc. (CIA), Model Draco, 7.62x39mm caliber pistol, which statement was intended and likely to deceive the licensed dealer of firearms, as a fact material to the lawfulness of such sale of said firearm under Chapter 44 of Title 18, in that he executed a Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms Form 4473, Firearms Transaction Record, representing that he was Alejandro Macedo on the form, when in fact that is not his true identity.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(a)(6) and 924(a)(2).

COUNT 7

On or about November 30, 2009, in the District of Arizona, defendant JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, intentionally and knowingly made a false and fictitious oral and written statement to, a licensed dealer of firearms within the meaning of Chapter 44, Title 18, United States Code, in connection with the acquisition of firearms, specifically a Bushmaster, model XM15-E2S, .223 caliber rifle and a FNH, model USG, 5.7x28 caliber pistol, which statement was intended and likely to deceive the licensed dealer of firearms, as a fact material to the lawfulness of such sale of said firearm under Chapter 44 of Title 18, in that he executed a Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms Form 4473, Firearms Transaction Record, representing that he was Alejandro Macedo on the form, when in fact that is not his true identity.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(a)(6) and 924(a)(2).

COUNT 8

On or about December 2, 2009, in the District of Arizona, defendant JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, intentionally and knowingly made a false and fictitious oral and written statement to, a licensed dealer of firearms within the meaning of Chapter 44, Title 18, United States Code, in connection with the acquisition of firearms, specifically a Colt, model 02071ELC2, .38 super caliber pistol and a FNH, model USG, 5.7x28 caliber pistol, which statement was intended and likely to deceive the licensed dealer of firearms, as a fact material to the lawfulness of such sale of said firearm under Chapter 44 of Title 18, in that he executed a Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms Form 4473, Firearms Transaction Record, representing that he was Alejandro

Macedo on the form, when in fact that is not his true identity.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(a)(6) and 924(a)(2).

COUNT 9

On or about May 17, 2010, in the District of Arizona, defendant JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, intentionally and knowingly made a false and fictitious oral and written statement to, a licensed dealer of firearms within the meaning of Chapter 44, Title 18, United States Code, in connection with the acquisition of a firearm, specifically a Century International Arms, Inc. (CIA), Model WASR10, 7.62x39mm caliber rifle, which statement was intended and likely to deceive the licensed dealer of firearms, as a fact material to the lawfulness of such sale of said firearm under Chapter 44 of Title 18, in that he executed a Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms Form 4473, Firearms Transaction Record, representing that he was Alejandro Macedo on the form, when in fact that is not his true identity.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(a)(6) and 924(a)(2).

COUNT 10

On or about May 18, 2010, in the District of Arizona, defendant JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, intentionally and knowingly made a false and fictitious oral and written statement to, a licensed dealer of firearms within the meaning of Chapter 44, Title 18, United States Code, in connection with the acquisition of firearms, specifically a Lancaster Arms, Model NDS-3, 7.62x39mm caliber rifle and five Century International Arms, Inc. (CIA), Model WASR10, 7.62x39mm caliber rifles, which statement was intended and likely to deceive the licensed dealer of firearms, as a fact material to the lawfulness of such sale of said firearm under Chapter 44 of Title 18, in that he executed a Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms Form 4473, Firearms Transaction Record, representing that he was Alejandro Macedo on the form, when in fact that is not his true identity.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(a)(6) and 924(a)(2).

COUNT 11

On or about November 27, 2009, in the District of Arizona and elsewhere, JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, did knowingly use, without lawful authority, a means of identification of another person, specifically the identification of Alejandro Macedo, during and in relation to Title 18, United States Code, Section 922(a)(6), False Statement in Connection With Acquisition of a Firearm.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1028A.

COUNT 12

On or about November 30, 2009, in the District of Arizona and elsewhere, JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, did knowingly use, without lawful authority, a means of identification of another person, specifically the identification of Alejandro Macedo, during and in relation to Title 18, United States Code, Section 922(a)(6), False Statement in Connection With Acquisition of a Firearm.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1028A.

COUNT 13

On or about December 2, 2009, in the District of Arizona and elsewhere, JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, did knowingly use, without lawful authority, a means of identification of another person, specifically the identification of Alejandro Macedo, during and in relation to Title 18, United States Code, Section 922(a)(6), False Statement in Connection With Acquisition of a Firearm.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1028A.

COUNT 14

On or about May 17, 2010, in the District of Arizona and elsewhere, JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, did knowingly use, without lawful authority, a means of identification of another person, specifically the identification of Alejandro Macedo, during and in relation to Title 18,

United States Code, Section 922(a)(6), False Statement in Connection With Acquisition of a 1 Firearm. 2 3 In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1028A. 4 COUNT 15 5 On or about May 18, 2010, in the District of Arizona and elsewhere, JOSE SAUCEDA-6 CUEVAS, did knowingly use, without lawful authority, a means of identification of another 7 person, specifically the identification of Alejandro Macedo, during and in relation to Title 18, 8 United States Code, Section 922(a)(6), False Statement in Connection With Acquisition of a 9 Firearm. 10 In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1028A. 11 COUNT 16 12 On or about November 27, 2009, in the District of Arizona, defendant JOSE SAUCEDA-13 CUEVAS, an alien illegally and unlawfully in the United States, did knowingly possess, a 14 Century International Arms, Inc. (CIA), Model Draco, 7.62x39mm

crimes punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, did knowingly possess a firearm, specifically: Century International Arms, Inc. (CIA), Model WASR10, 7.62x39mm caliber rifle, which had been shipped and transported in interstate and foreign commerce.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(g)(1) and 924(a)(2).

COUNT 25

On or about May 18, 2010, in the District of Arizona, defendant, JOSE SAUCEDA-CUEVAS, having been previously convicted of:

- Criminal Possession of a Forgery Device on or about February 9, 2006, Superior Court of Arizona, Maricopa County, Case Number CR2004-018639 and
- Theft of Means of Transportation on or about February 9, 2006, Superior Court of Arizona, Maricopa County, Case Number CR2005-133046;

crimes punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, did knowingly possess firearms, specifically: a Lancaster Arms, Model NDS-3, 7.62x39mm caliber rifle and five Century International Arms, Inc. (CIA), Model WASR10, 7.62x39mm caliber rifles, which had been shipped and transported in interstate and foreign commerce.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(g)(1) and 924(a)(2).

FORFEITURE ALLEGATION

Upon conviction of the offenses in violation of Title 18 United States Code, Section 924(a)(1)(A), set forth in Counts 1 thorough 25, defendants shall forfeit to the United States, pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(d) and Title 28, United States Code, Section 2461(c), any firearms and/or ammunition involved in or used in the knowing violation of the statutes set forth above.
